This work has allowed me to share even more resources with you than I would have known about before.

This fall has been busy for me. I have met once with the Delaware Valley Friends School/Concord Quarter Care Committee, and twice with the Aging Concerns Working Group. Each group has planned activities for later in the fall for which I do a lot of the logistical work. The popular Hayride and Campfire Potluck did happen on October 6, despite the threat of rain. Earlier rain stopped at Wynnorr Farm (thanks so much to the Strattons for hosting us) at 4:45pm and we ended up having a great time with 37 participants!

Upcoming events include the annual Parents Morning Off, jointly organized with Western Quarter. Due to some other events happening in early December in the Quarter, we decided to try the Saturday before Thanksgiving, November 23, for this event. Parents get to drop off their children for a morning of crafts, games, outdoor play and lunch and we get to have fun with the children! Please RSVP.

You'll also hear more about the workshop planned by the Working Group on Aging Concerns. This group also meets monthly and anyone is welcome to attend. I manage a list serve for those who were trained as Aging Concerns Facilitators in 2018, and also recently had a question relevant to this group posted on the Concord Quarter Facebook page. My social work experience in finding resources for people serves me well in this job!

I am heartened by the increase in the number of families attending Quarterly Meeting. This is especially due to the energy and support of Melinda Wenner Bradley, the PYM Youth Religious Life Coordinator, and member at West Chester. We are committed now to offering children's programming at Quarterly Meeting starting at the beginning of the day, and she has either been involved directly, or indirectly each time this year. I've created an email group of families who have been involved with any Concord Quarter program over the last 2 years and plan to email them several times a year.
